

## **General Education and Other Graduation Requirements for students enrolled at SF State prior to Fall of 2014**

A new GE pattern will go into effect for students admitted to SF State in Fall 2014 or later. Continuing students who were admitted to SF State in Spring 2014 or earlier will not be required to complete the new pattern. In order to facilitate graduation, the following lists of courses include courses from both the old GE as well as those approved for the new GE. There is little benefit to trying to complete the new program, since there are new graduation requirements and all new GE courses have been incorporated into the lists below.

For ease of navigation, category designations in Segment II/Behavioral and Social Sciences and Segment II/Humanities and Creative Arts and cluster designations in Segment III were removed, since students are no longer held to them.

The list of courses below reflects GE courses approved as of the end of Spring 2014. The list will be updated regularly, at least once a year. For the most recent version of this document, go to <http://ugs.sfsu.edu/ugs/bacc-reqs/GraduationRequirements>.

In an effort to be consistent with changes in the new GE pattern, the following modifications have been made to the pre-Fall 2014 GE program:

1. After Spring 2014, completion of the OASIS tutorial is no longer required. The online lessons will still be available on the Library website.
2. For Segment I courses taken Fall 2014 or later, students must earn a CR or C- grade or higher in order to satisfy the GE requirement.
3. In Segment II and Segment III, students may take all courses from the same departmental prefix.
4. There is unlimited double counting between GE and the major. For example, a student may use all three Segment III courses to satisfy both the major and GE.
5. All students must complete a course that satisfies Lifelong Development (LLD). These courses can now be found in all areas of the curriculum, including Segments I, II, and III as well as courses in some majors, minors, or electives.
6. Students who began SF State as first-time freshmen must complete one course that is designated as fulfilling the American Ethnic and Racial Minorities (AERM) requirement. AERM courses can now be found in all areas of the curriculum, including Segments I, II, and III as well as courses in some majors, minors, or electives.
7. Students are no longer held to completing 9 units within the Physical and Biological Sciences (PBS), but must complete at least 3 units of Physical Sciences, 3 units of Biological Sciences, and complete at least one course approved as Laboratory or Field. Please note: students need 27 units minimum in Segment II – if a student completes PBS in 6 or 7 units, the additional 2-3 units can be taken from either Physical and Biological Sciences (PBS), Behavioral and Social Sciences (BSS), or Humanities and Creative Arts (HCA).

8. A single course in both Segment II and Segment III cannot be used to fulfill both requirements.
9. Courses taken in Fall of 2014 or later and certified as meeting both American Institutions and GE requirements (e.g., BSS, HCA, or Segment III), may be used to fulfill both requirements.
10. Students can satisfy the Cultural, Ethnic, or Social Diversity (CESD) requirement by taking an upper division General Education course that appears on the modified Segment III list and is also approved for AERM or SJ. Students who began at SF State as first-time freshmen who take an AERM course to satisfy CESD must complete a second AERM course (one for the Segment II AERM requirement and one for the Segment III CESD requirement).
11. Students who began their studies at SF State prior to Fall 2014 and who are readmitted with a minimum of 90 semester units, at least 30 of which were completed at SF State, will be placed on the pre-Fall 2014 GE program. Readmit students returning with fewer units will be held to the GE program effective at the time of readmission. After reviewing their Degree Progress Report, these students should consult with the Undergraduate Advising Center about appropriate placement of prior coursework in the current GE if necessary.
12. Please note, some courses previously in Segment III have changed to lower division (course numbers 100-299) and are now found in Segment II. For a course to count for Segment III, it must be upper division at the time it was taken. Please refer to the student's DARS/DPR to verify upper division status of the course when taken.
13. Some courses on the lists below were offered prior to Fall 2014, but were not approved for the General Education program. These courses may only be used to satisfy General Education requirements if they are taken Fall 2014 or later.
14. If a course was previously in GE and is now approved for a different area of GE (e.g., BSS to UD-GE or BSS to HCA, etc.), the course will satisfy the new area for which it was approved. Therefore, what the course fulfills depends on when the student took the course and for what it was approved at the time it was taken.

## Segment II – 27 units minimum

- A single course in both Segment II and Segment III cannot be used to fulfill both requirements.
- If a course was previously in GE and is now approved for a different area of GE (e.g., BSS to UD-GE or BSS to HCA, etc.), the course will satisfy the new area for which it was approved. Therefore, what the course fulfills depends on when the student took the course and for what it was approved at the time it was taken.
- Courses taken in Fall of 2014 or later and certified as meeting both American Institutions and GE requirements, may be used to fulfill both requirements.
- Students who began as first-time freshmen must complete one course that is designated as fulfilling the American Ethnic and Racial Minorities (AERM) requirement and one course that is designated as fulfilling the Lifelong Development (LLD) requirement. Some courses have been approved to satisfy both requirements. Transfer students are not required to complete the American Ethnic and Racial Minorities (AERM) requirement. Beginning Fall 2014, AERM and LLD courses may be found throughout the curriculum and not just within Segment II (e.g., anywhere in GE, major, minor, electives).

## Physical and Biological Sciences (PBS) – 6 units minimum

Notes: If only 6-7 units are taken to satisfy PBS, an additional BSS or HCA course must be taken to achieve 27 units in Segment II. If your major requires CHEM 115, that course will satisfy PBS-A and the lab/field requirement. If your major requires BIOL 230, that course will satisfy PBS-B and the lab/field requirement. If a course satisfying the laboratory or field (L/F) requirement is not built into a PBS-A, PBS-B or PBS-C course, it must be associated with a course approved in one of the three areas.

Please note: Beginning Fall 2015, Geology, Meteorology and Oceanography courses now fall under the department prefix “Earth Science”, or EARTH for short.

3. If a course was previously in GE and is now approved for a different area of GE (e.g., BSS to UD-GE or BSS to HCA, etc.), the course will satisfy the new area for which it was approved. Therefore, what the course fulfills depends on when the student took the course and for what it was approved at the time it was taken.
4. Students can satisfy the Cultural, Ethnic, or Social Diversity (CESD) requirement by taking an upper division General Education course that appears on the modified Segment III list and is also approved for AERM or SJ. Students who began at SF State as first-time freshmen who take an AERM course to satisfy CESD must complete a second AERM course (one for the Segment II AERM requirement and one for the Segment III CESD requirement).
5. Segment III courses taken in Fall of 2014 or later and certified as also meeting American Institutions (US History/USH, US Government/USG, and California State and Local Government/CSLG), may be used to fulfill both requirements.
6. Students wishing to fulfill Segment III through CSU Study Abroad should consult with the Office of International Programs and the Advising Center.
7. Please note, some courses previously in Segment III have changed to lower division (course numbers 100-299) and are now found in Segment II. For a course to count for Segment III, it must be upper division at the time it was taken. Please refer to the DARS/DPR to verify upper division status of the course when taken.
